2018 is bound to bring some change to Simcoe Terrace, as does every year. One new program that I can announce will see Simcoe Terrace partner with LOFT Community Services and Royal Victoria Hospital to alleviate the overcrowding situation. Many seniors reside at RVH for longer than necessary because they don't qualify for long term care, but have some needs that cant presently be met in their homes or in typical retirement homes. The program "Seniors to Home", funded by the Ministry of Health, will allow those seniors to leave hospital, move into Simcoe Terrace with minimal help from LOFT Community Services PSW's, who will be scheduled and on site around the clock.

Flowers, Stones and Signs for December Babies

The December birth flowers are **holly** and **narcissus**. The holly symbolizes your wish for domestic happiness. Although some animals and birds enjoy holly berries, they are semi-toxic to humans. The narcissus conveys that you want your beloved to stay just the way they are. While there are many types of narcissus, the paper white is the winter-growing variety and the birth flower for December.

December's birthstones offer three ways to fight the winter blues: tanzanite, zircon and turquoise – best known for beautiful shades of blue. Since the Middle Ages, people have believed that zircon can induce sleep, ward off evil and promote prosperity. From ancient Egyptians to Persians, Aztecs and Native Americans, kings and warriors alike admired turquoise for thousands of years. It adorned everything from jewelry to ceremonial masks to weapons and bridles – granting power and protection, particularly against falls. Tanzanite is the exquisite blue variety of the mineral zoisite that is only found in one part of the world. Named for its limited geographic origin in Tanzania, tanzanite has quickly risen to popularity since its relatively recent discovery.
